Identification

Students will receive differentiated instruction based on their individual needs throughout the elementary years K-6. Starting in grade two, students who demonstrate a high academic aptitude and interest will be invited for further testing for acceptance into the Challenge program. MAP scores are a key data point to help us identify high achieving students and academic potential.

Our goal is always to properly identify every student for placement. Each student is evaluated on the same rubric to ensure a uniform and authentic placement criteria.

Challenge Program

Our program was deliberately created to engage an interdisciplinary instructional model to support students in exploring areas of interest while enhancing other areas where they may have less familiarity. Students will have the opportunity to work individually to enrich personal growth while also working in a group environment to build leadership and teamwork skills. Instructors support individual growth while offering open-ended activities and opportunities within the classroom to promote skills that can be applied in real-world settings.

Challenge Units

The school year will divided into five units. Each unit will have two instructors highlighting his or her unique expertise.

Varying the themes of the five-week units will help every student enhance current interests or explore new areas.

Unit One: Music & Movement
Unit Two: STEAM
Unit Three: Arts Inspiration
Unit Four:
Mindfulness, Mindset & Well-Being

Unit Five: Innovation Lab

The Challenge Program is intended to enhance and supplement regular classroom instruction. Students should not feel overwhelmed with additional coursework and homework. Once a student is identified for Challenge, he or she may remain in the program until grade six. While they will miss some classroom instruction, students are expected to maintain their academic performance to remain in the Challenge Program.
